<b>Digital Equity for All Learners: Beyond the Homework Gap</b>	10:10am-11:05am	<p>The global pandemic has revealed that the Digital Divide and Homework Gap may be bigger than anticipated. A recent paper from Common Sense Media reported that 15-16 million students lack sufficient access to the Internet, and 9 million of those students also lack access to a laptop, tablet, or computer. When looking more closely at that data, a majority of those students identify as Black, Indigenous, or as a Person of Color (BIPOC).</p> <p>Beyond just access, a Digital Use Divide also impacts learners. Students from Title I schools, which also tend to have large percentages of BIPOC students, have fewer opportunities to use technology in creative, meaningful ways. Instead, available tools are used primarily for drill-and-practice, test-prep, remediation, and content delivery - what S. Craig Watkins refers to as a “technology rich, curriculum poor environment.” In this panel discussion, we will move beyond discussions of access and accessibility to address the ways in which district technology leaders can ensure equity for ALL learners.</p>
